Boston Terrier Club of Connecticut's AKC NUTMEG TROT & BTCC Group Walk

Please read the following rules and registration form:

Safety First! Before starting any exercise, make sure that you have your doctor's approval, and that your dog has a veterinarian's approval. Dog(s) must be up to date on all vaccinations, unless medically excused.

Age of dogs Dogs must be at least 6 months old to receive a Trot certification.

Aggression For safety, dogs who have aggression issues are not eligible to walk with the group. They may walk after the group, if time permits.

Bitches in season As a courtesy, bitches in season should not walk with the group. They may walk after the group, if time permits.

Collars, harnesses, leashes Dogs may wear slip collars, buckle collars, Martingales, and body harnesses. They may not wear flex leads (extendable leashes), prong collars or e-collars. Muzzles and head collars may be worn. Leashes should be 4 ft. to 6 ft. long and fabric or leather. Dogs must be on leash at all times. Local leash laws shall be followed.

Walking more than 1 dog The handler may walk one or two dogs if the handler's two dogs are typically walked at the same time. Documentation/Registration will be submitted for each dog. Eligibility This event is being held by the BTCC, an AKC licensed club. Note: Dogs must be at least 6 months old at the time of the walk, and need to be registered or enrolled with AKC and have an AKC, PAL, or AKC Canine Partners number when the Title Application is submitted.

Fees The fee for today's walk is \$20 and due at registration. Certificates will be provided after the trot is completed. There are no refunds. There is no rain date. Note: Our fee does not include the fee paid to AKC by the owner for the processing of the AKC FIT DOG title (owner submits on line).

Handlers The handler may be the dog owner or the dog owner's designee.

Misc: Owner/Handler is responsible to pick up after their dog(s) and dispose in a trash barrel. Liability AKC FIT DOG activities are done at the dog owner/handler's own risk. The BTCC will assume no responsibility for any personal injury or death to any persons; theft, damage or loss of personal property nor injury or death of any animal either at this event or on the show grounds at any time. At any time that a dog or handler is not feeling well or appears to be injured, the activity should stop immediately. The owner/handler is responsible to have their dog(s) under their full control at all times, on the park grounds and parking lot.
